Privatization through Preemption

Explains how new regulations shifts control over health data collection networks from states to private firms. Argues that this replacement of federalism with privatization represents a novel intervention in the literature, and explores implications. Early stage draft available for review.

Sets out incentives that can be used to incentivize providers and payers to join a national network (aimed at a peer reviewed journal).

Concentric Regulation in Health Data Blocking

Uses health data regulation as a case study, to show how the government uses both market power and command and control regulation in interactive ways to achieve regulatory goals.

Law and Medical Metaphors

Examines how different kinds of metaphors (consumerist, civil rights, moralistic, and Parsonian) are embedded in the law, and argues that a "civil rights" metaphor best conforms to basic bioethical principles.
