
Wittemyer Courtroom A/V How-To

1 Getting Started

a) Touch the screen to wake it up. Choose **Projector or Audio Only** if when it prompts you to select a mode. For audio only skip to step 2. The lights can be changed under Lights below:



b) Plug in your laptop. You can choose from VGA, MiniDP, or HDMI.







c) Choose the correct color and input you plugged in to display it on the projector. You can choose displays for both the **Center** and **Side Projectors**. If you are using the podium computer and not your personal laptop, choose **Podium PC** under the blue input section.





2 Audio Controls

a) If you need audio, plug one of the audio cables (attached to the VGA cables) into the headphone port on your laptop.


b) Press Audio Routing near the bottom of the screen. (Press Projector Video when you're

ready to return to the main screen.)



c) Choose whether you are using the **Blue** or **Green** audio cable. The volume of the audio can be controlled using the **Program Volume** controls on top of the screen.





d) If you are using the podium microphone, make sure it is turned on before speaking.

When turned on, there will be a green light on the base. The volume of the mic can be controlled using the **Speech Volume** controls on the top of the screen.





3 Screen Controls

a) When the system starts, the center screen automatically comes down. If you need to bring it up, or you need the side screens to come down, press **Screen Control** near the bottom of the screen. (Press **Projector Video** when you're

ready to return to the main screen.)



b) Find the control section for the screen you wish to raise or lower, and press the **up** or **down** arrows. Don't forget to also turn the corresponding projector **on** or **off**.



WARNING!

NEVER push this button during your event:

Pushing Shutdown will shut down all projectors, screens, **AND THE CAMERAS** that are recording your event.



If you do press Shutdown by accident press No, Go Back!
